Oulart – The Ballagh Camogie Club was formed in the late 1970's. We are a small rural Club comprising of two villages Oulart and the Ballagh - situated approx. 8 miles from Enniscorthy and 14 miles from Gorey in Co. Wexford.

Since formation, the Club has enjoyed great success, initially at under age level with many titles won at u-12, u-14, u-16 and u-18 levels and then at Junior, Intermediate and Senior levels. The Club achieved an incredible 5 in a row premier Féile na nGael Camogie titles from 1998 to 2002. A great feature of this 5 in a row was that a current team member Una Leacy, played an influential role in all 5 wins. A feat that will probably never be equalled!

To date the Club has won 11 County Senior Club titles (in 2003, 04, 05, 06, 07, 09, 10, 11, 12, 14 & 15). They also are the holders of 5 Leinster Senior Club titles won in 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 & 2014. The Club also reached the "holy grail" of All-Ireland Senior Club champions on two occasions – in 2011 and 2014.

St. Vincents GAA Club was founded in November 1931 to provide an opportunity for the youth of the north east of Dublin to play Gaelic football and hurling. Over the following decades St. Vincents became the dominant force in Dublin GAA,

providing leading players to the county's hurling and football teams – a tradition that continues to this day with Ger Brennan Diarmuid Connolly and Michael Savage. The Club won All-Ireland Club Football titles in 1976, 2008 and again in 2014.

In 1996 St. Vincents and the local Marino Camogie Club (founded in 1973) amalgamated.

The Club brought home its first Dublin Senior Camogie Championship in 1998 when the team went on to reach the All-Ireland final. It has since captured another three senior titles (2005, 2007 and 2015). St. Vincents has always placed a great emphasis on the development of our younger players and, as it did with Marino, this ethos has resulted in strong dominance at juvenile level in the county over the years – the Club won the U14 All-Ireland Camogie Féile in 2003.

St. Vincents currently caters for over 1,400 members, more than half of whom are juvenile hurlers, footballers, camogie and ladies football players. We field three adult camogie teams, juvenile camogie teams at every age group (U8-U16), and we have a large nursery of 4-7 year-old camogiers. The Club is represented on county teams at all levels and we are particularly delighted that two of our senior inter-county players, Ali Maguire and Sarah O'Donovan, have been nominated for All-Stars in 2015.

We are delighted to be involved in this Leinster Final with Oulart-the-Ballagh. Our Clubs have enjoyed a good relationship over the years through playing each other in challenge games, particularly at juvenile level..

By now Myshall was one of the strongest on the club scene in Leinster & was widely recognised with most of the club team playing for Carlow county team. Throughout these years a lot of work was being put into the juvenile structure and in 1989 the club had probably one of its most successful years since forming winning the u.14, u.16, u.18 & senior championships.

The Summer of 1995 is a year Myshall Senior team will remember for a long time playing 4 matches in 6 days as the headline in the paper states "From County Final to Leinster Final in 6 days" in which they defeated Camross in front of a large home crowd. The club added the Leinster title again in 1998.

After a lapse of 12 years without a Leinster, the club came storming back in 2011 and won the title beating Lough Lene Gaels (Westmeath). By now the Junior All Ireland Club Championship was in place and Myshall headed off on the boat to Ruislip losing out narrowly to Tara of London in the All Ireland semi final.

This defeat created a hunger & desire in this present bunch of girls and were rewarded the following year 2012 when they claimed their first All Ireland Junior title beating Four Roads (Roscommon) & creating further history for both club & county. In 2013 they won back to back All Ireland club championships defeating Scariff/Ogonnelloe (Clare) in the Final.

In 2014 Myshall played in the Intermediate Championship for the first time in the history of

the club & county and were narrowly defeated by eventual All Ireland winners Piltown (Kilkenny).

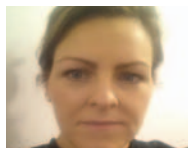

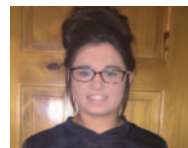

Though we are a senior club, we acknowledge the work of Mammys and Daddies, tea-makers, fundraisers, pitch management, our sponsors and supporters, all of whom play an integral part in our current successes. Our management team, Mattie, Robbie, Richie and Damien along with our officers, James, Danika and Sinead have worked hard all year behind the scenes in getting us to this point and we are committed to doing our part on the field.
